

THE CHARLES STEWART MOTT PROFESSORSHIP IN COMMUNITY EDUCATION

The Charles Stewart Mott Professorship, an Eminent Scholar's Chair in Community Education, housed in the College of Education at Florida Atlantic University in Boca Raton, Florida, is responsible for providing visionary and pragmatic leadership for Community Education on the local, state, national and international levels. There are administrative, research, teaching, and service functions identified as optimum standards of performance for whomever holds this Chair.

Administratively, the Eminent Scholar reports directly to the Dean of the College of Education through preparation of the annual budget and annual report. The annual report assesses inter- and intra-university linkages, accomplishments of the past year's objectives and goals, and includes a statement of plans and objectives for the following year. The Eminent scholar also reports and represents Florida Atlantic University at all levels, locally, regionally, nationally and internationally. The Eminent Scholar is the foremost advocate for Community Education in terms of scholarship, service and teaching.

The Eminent Scholar shall

Present public lectures and programs that forward the conceptual framework[s] of Community Education.

Work with the college and university for adequate state, national and international funding of the community education concept.

Prepare proposals to secure additional resources for community education at Florida Atlantic University.

Teach two classes each academic year.

Conduct research in community education.

Coordinate research projects with faculty in community education.

Disseminate the results of research in appropriate journals and other prestigious outlets.

Respond to local, state, national, and international requests for workshops, lectures, and conferences.

Provide consultative services in community education to schools, universities, and other organizations and associations.

Participate in appropriate professional, civic, and community activities.

Serve on at least one major college or university committee annually.

Foster the development of university-wide research in Community Education
